**Re: Complaint regarding disproportionate ticket allocation to the National Cricket Club by Mr. Madhusudan Das Mundhra & Ors.**

**Order No. 6 Dated 10<sup>th</sup> January, 2026.**

On the prayer of the learned Advocate appearing for CAB, time for filing response to the complaint of the complainants was extended till December, 2025 vide Order No. 5 dated 22<sup>nd</sup> November, 2025.

CAB has not yet submitted its response to the above complaint of the complainants till date.

On the prayer of Mr. Sen, learned Advocate appearing for CAB, time for submission of such response along with all documents on which CAB wants to rely upon, is extended till 31<sup>st</sup> January, 2026.

Considering that, ICC, T20 World-Cup may be exhibited at Eden Gardens on 7<sup>th</sup> February, 2026, it is made clear that no further adjournment will be granted to any of the parties under any circumstances.

It is thus, made clear that, in case CAB decides not to submit its response to the said complaint of the complainants, CAB may contest the proceeding by producing the records; however, in such case, CAB is required to intimate its adversaries, the documents on which they will be rely upon in course of hearing and in such case if inspection of those documents, is sought for by any of its adversaries, CAB is required

to give inspection of those documents to its adversaries well in advance of the date of hearing, but positively by 27<sup>th</sup> January, 2026, so that, its adversaries can effectively participate in the hearing by giving their reaction to those documents in course of hearing. It is also made clear that in case supply of copy of any of the documents is insisted upon by the adversaries, CAB is directed to supply such copy or copies to them, if it is not so voluminous and if voluminous, at the cost of the party applying for such copy.

Next sitting will be held on **31<sup>st</sup> January, 2026 at 7:30p.m.**, at the same venue with the clear understanding that the matter will be taken up for hearing on that day even if no response is submitted by CAB in terms of the direction as given herein above.

Let the Vakalatnama filed by Mr. Mukherjee on behalf of Mr. Sudhir Mohta be kept with the record.

CAB is directed to communicate this order to all concerned, at the earliest.
